

DISCOVERY ORDER

Pursuant to Vermont Rule of Criminal Procedure 12.1(c)(1) the Court sets the following deadlines:

FELONY STATUS and PROSECUTION DISCLOSURES TO DEFENSE within 4 weeks (28 days) from arraignment.

- Deadline for prosecution's V.R.Cr.P. 16 disclosures by this date.
- V.R.E. 804a notices due to the defense by this date.
- Complex felony case-specific discovery order to issue on this date. Discovery will be governed by the regular felony discovery order if no alternate order is agreed upon/ordered. Status conferences (or intervening motion hearing) for complex felonies will be scheduled every 12 weeks thereafter.

DEFENSE DISCLOSURES TO PROSECUTION to be made at week 7 (49 days) from arraignment as follows:

- Deadline for defense general V.R.Cr.P. 16 disclosures to prosecution;
- Defense disclosure of reports, exams, expert testimony per V.R.Cr.P 16.1(b);
- Misdemeanor deposition deadline;
- Defense V.R.Cr.P. 12.1 alibi, insanity, expert notices (all case types).

MISDEMEANOR MOTIONS DEADLINE to be filed by week 11 (77 days) from arraignment.

MISDEMEANOR STATUS CONFERENCE to be held at week 12 (84 days) from arraignment.

- This status will be cancelled in the event that a motion is filed; a motion hearing will be set.

FELONY DEPOSITION DEADLINE to be complete by week 17 (119 days).

FELONY MOTION DEADLINE to be filed by week 20 (140 days) from arraignment.

- Hearing on motions(s) will be set as next event.

FELONY STATUS to be held at week 21 (147 days since arraignment)

- If no motions have been filed, the matter will be set for pretrial/trial.

MISDEMEANOR PRETRIAL AND TRIAL to be set at week 26 (182 days/ 6 mos.) from arraignment.

FELONY PRETRIAL AND TRIAL at week 52 (364 days)(approximately 1 year).
