

Important Information Regarding Jury Service at the Chittenden Superior Court Criminal Division

Juror Reporting Instructions

Call the juror phone at 802-651-1942 after 5:00pm the night before you are scheduled for jury service for reporting instructions.

Directions

Parking for Your First Day

The courthouse is located at 32 Cherry Street, Suite 300, Burlington, VT., across from Macy's.

There is a multi-level parking garage next to Macy's Department Store-Lakeview/College Garage- **(closest to the lake)** directly across from the Costello Courthouse. (DO NOT PARK AT BURLINGTON TOWN CENTER GARAGE). Parking at Macy's will be for the panel report dates to include the first day. Save your receipt and the court will provide you with a parking voucher to give to the attendant as you exit the parking garage at the end of the day.

Where to report

Please report ONLY to the jurors' entry door located on the Pearl Street side of the building. Press the button on the speaker box at the right of the door and identify yourself as a juror. Please wait outside and the court officer will let you in the building as soon as possible and escort you to the courtroom.

Time Commitment Expectations

You are to serve on no more than three trials during your term of jury service. Each trial lasts on the average of one or two days. The cases you will hear involve alleged criminal acts.

The final day of a trial can go into evening hours due to deliberations.

What You Can Expect at a Jury Draw

Court staff will greet you and present a general orientation, answer your questions and discuss your concerns. You will then meet the judge with whom you will be working during your term. She

or he will discuss our system of justice and answer your questions.

The rest of the day will be spent drawing juries from your panel for specific trials. Plan to stay at court until at least 4:30pm.

Emergencies/Reporting Absences/Excuses

If illness or emergency affects your jury service, please call 802-651-1753 by 8:00am and speak with Sadonna Delibac or send email to: Sadonna.Delibac@vermont.gov

Medical excuses are given first priority. A note from your physician must accompany all medical requests. The court always works with you to plan around scheduled appointments, vacations, or business hardship. We try to minimize the disruption that jury service might cause you.

Miscellaneous

Please note that anyone entering the building may be screened by a court security officer. You may not bring weapons into the courthouse.

Due to the nature of jury service and the court process itself, there are often periods of waiting. You may bring reading material to pass the time. There are brief recesses throughout the day. No childcare is available.

Smokers will be directed to a designated area outside the building.

Lunch

Lunch is normally one hour. You may choose to go out or you may bring your lunch and eat in the jury room.

Other Concerns

If you have any special needs, please bring them to the court clerk's attention. All electronic devices, including cell phones, must be turned off while court is in session.

Hearing assistance devices can be made available.
